



Frequently Asked Questions

Where is the event being held?

Camp Hoblitzelle- Salvation Army Camp
Midlothian, Texas
Approximately 45 minutes from Dallas

Does an adult chaperone have to attend?

An adult needs to attend with their students. Our policies state that each school requires an adult chaperone onsite during the entire event to attend.

Can I ask another school to watch my students if an adult from our school cannot attend?

We are sorry but we cannot ask another school to be responsible for your students.

Will there be medical and security professionals at the Camp?

Yes, a registered nurse will be onsite 24/7 during the duration of the camp as well as security professionals.

What happens if I don't have equal number of boys and girls to send as a team? Can I send a team made up of either two girls, two boys or a single student?

We prefer schools send their teams in the form of one boy and one girl. However, we know this cannot be the case for all schools. If you are unable to provide a team of one boy and one girl, we encourage you to please submit your application for review and consideration.

Can I send more than one team?

Yes! A chaperone can bring up to 5 teams (10 students), preferably equal number of boys to girl ratio.

How many chaperones can my school bring?

One chaperone can bring up to 10 students. However, for schools traveling with 2 students, 1 chaperone is permissible; 4 or more students, 2 chaperones are permissible.

Maximum number of students per school is 10. Maximum number of chaperones per school is 2.

When do applications close?

All applications must be submitted to the Herzog Foundation by Friday, September 18 at 4pm CT.

When does registration open?

Once your application is approved, an email will be sent to all accepted teams with a link to register. Each team member, including adult chaperone, must register separately for the event. Registration links will be live from May- September 30, 2026.

What expenses are paid for by the Herzog Foundation?

Once at the Faith and Nation Student Forum, all meals, lodging, and camp activities are provided courtesy of the Herzog Foundation for all students and chaperones.

Schools are responsible for their travel expenses to and from the *camp if driving* or to *Dallas if flying*. If flying, the Herzog Foundation will provide a shuttle from both Dallas-Fort Worth and Love Field airports in Dallas to the Camp.

In support of your school's participation, we are pleased to help offset travel costs for attending chaperones. Once accepted to attend the Faith and Nation Student Forum, your school will receive a \$500 award per chaperone (up to two chaperones) to help offset chaperone travel costs to and from the Forum. Payment to the school will occur after the conclusion of the 2026 Faith and Nation Student Forum Event.

For each school traveling with 2 students, 1 chaperone is permissible; 4 or more students, 2 chaperones are permissible. Maximum number of students per school is 10. Maximum number of chaperones per school is 2.

Details on how to receive your school's award is outlined in the event's registration details. Payment to the school will occur after the conclusion of the 2026 Faith and Nation Student Forum Event.

When should we arrive to the Camp?

Arrival on Sunday, November 1 by 4pm.

If flying, your flight should arrive at either Love Field or Dallas-Fort Worth between 11am-3pm local time on Sunday, November 1. Shuttles will run between early afternoon- early evening from each airport to the Camp.

If you arrive after shuttle hours, you will be responsible for your own transportation from the airport to the Camp. Please alert the Herzog Foundation, if this is the case by emailing us at faithandnation@herzogfoundation.com.

When should we schedule to leave the Camp?

Expect to be at the Camp until 12pm on November 4. Flight departure from the either Love Field or Dallas-Fort Worth shall be no earlier than 4pm on November 4.

Will there be a shuttle from the airport to the Camp and back?

Yes, a Herzog Foundation provided bus shuttle will pick up schools attending Faith and Nation from both Love Field and Dallas-Fort Worth airports on Sunday, November 1. Shuttles will also be available on Wednesday, November 4 to return guests to Love Field or Dallas-Fort Worth airports.

When registering, please provide your flight information so we can coordinate your shuttle. Details will be shared on pick up times and procedures a week or two before the event date.

Where will adult chaperones be housed?

Adult chaperones will be housed offsite at the Courtyard by Marriott in Midlothian, approximately 15 minutes from the Camp. Chaperones will have their own individual room. All lodging provided by the Herzog Foundation. A daily shuttle to and from the hotel/camp will be provided by the Herzog Foundation.

Where will the students be housed?

Student will be housed at the Camp. Girls will be housed with other girls along with a female adult camp counselors in dorm style rooms with shower and toilet facilities. Boys will be housed with other boys along with male adult camp counselors in dorm style rooms with shower and toilet facilities.

Will my student be with their chaperone and fellow students during the camp?

The time spent together with between students and chaperones will be limited. Some meals and activities will incorporate both students and chaperones.

What other things are planned at the Camp other than speakers and small groups?

Outdoor activities are provided by the Camp and are met for guest downtime and relaxation. Additional downtime is planned after evening activities each day until lights out.

Do I need to bring my own bedding and towels?

Bedding and towels will be provided by the Camp. Student should pack personal care items such as shampoo and liquid body soap.

Do students need to pack any spending money?

Other than what students will need to travel to and from the camp, students do not need any spending money while at the camp, unless your student desires to purchase coffee or camp memorabilia from the Camp's store.

What kind of attire shall students pack?

Comfortable, classroom appropriate attire (no uniforms) is required for speaking sessions. Please no pajama pants, sleep ware or slippers outside of bedtime. Plan to pack outdoor appropriate clothing for outdoor activities.
